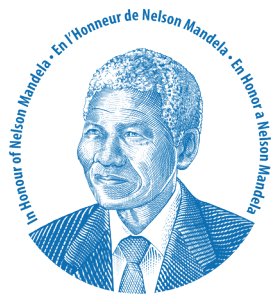

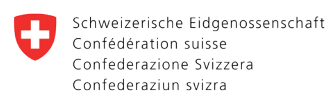
World Human Rights Moot Court Competition

Take bus 28 in the direction of the airport. Get off at the airport and take bus 10 in the direction of 'Rive' and get off at 'Balectert' bus stop

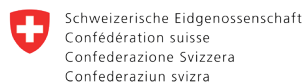
