African Union Human Rights Prize

The Centre for Human Rights was awarded the 2012 African Union Human Rights Prize in recognition of the Centre's contribution to the work of the African Commission on Human and Peoples' Rights in the promotion and protection of human rights in Africa.

UNESCO Prize for Human Rights Education

The Centre for Human Rights was awarded the UNESCO Prize for Human Rights Education, with particular recognition for the African Human Rights Moot Court Competition and the LLM in Human Rights and Democratisation in Africa.
