Master's degree (LLM/MPhil) in Disability Rights in Africa

The LLM/MPhil in Disability Rights in Africa is a unique two-year programme and is offered as a blended learning course comprising of online interaction and residential block-weeks in Pretoria. Two contact sessions (block-weeks) are scheduled during the first year of the programme.

LLM/MPhil (DRIA) - Eligibility criteria

- **Law students (LLM option):**
A degree allowing access to the legal profession
- **Non-law students (MPhil option):**
At least an Honours degree in a discipline relevant to disability rights

Foreign qualifications are subject to South African Qualifications Authority (SAQA) requirements.

Applicants must have excellent academic credentials and demonstrate human rights experience or interest. A maximum of fifteen students will be accepted for the 2025 - 2026 academic year.

Cost estimation

Students paid a combined total of approximately R37 000 for the 2023 and 2024 academic years. This is a general guide and applicants should note that tuition fees for the 2025 - 2026 academic years are likely to increase. Kindly please also note that fees might be higher for international students.

In addition to registration and tuition fees, students have to finance their travel to and accommodation during the contact block sessions, which are compulsory to attend. (A total of four contact sessions, each lasting one week, will be scheduled over the two-year period).
