Advanced Human Rights Course Women's Rights in Africa

The Centre for Human Rights, University of Pretoria, will host a 5-day intensive short course on Women's Rights in Africa from 26 to 30 October 2020.

The course provides a balance between theory and practical advocacy skills useful for practitioners from across the continent working in areas relating to women's rights.

The course examines the international and regional human rights frameworks that guarantee the human rights of women and girls in Africa, with a particular focus on the Protocol to the African Charter on Human and Peoples Rights on the Rights of Women in Africa (Maputo Protocol).

The course provides an opportunity to critically evaluate the potential of these human rights frameworks to challenge obstacles undermining the effective protection of women's rights in Africa.

Course Outline

The course components include:

- An introduction to international, regional and subregional frameworks on the human rights of women and girls.
- A critical examination of the concept of gender equality and the approaches to understanding gender equality and gender justice, including feminism and intersectionality.
- Explore questions of cultural relativism, religion and gender norms in advancing women's rights
- Practical ideas on using the law and human rights principles in promoting women's rights
- Reflect on key elements of advocacy and lobby planning and share information on positive interventions.
