Main Conference Themes

We welcome submissions on all areas of focus of the various LSGL research groups, but preference will be given to contributions on one of the two following topics:

Global Private Law: This theme invites contributions focusing on the evolving nature of private law, its implications for cross-border transactions, and the challenges and opportunities presented by the ever-expanding interconnectedness of legal systems.

The Past, Present and Future of Legal Education: This theme encourages submissions that delve into past, present and possible future trends in legal education, the integration of technology in pedagogical approaches, and the role of law schools in preparing the next legal professionals for the complexities of a globalized world.





Submission Guidelines

Applicants are invited to submit paper proposals of 300 to 500 words, together with a short CV. All submissions must be sent to lsgl.winter2024@law.kyushu-u.ac.jp no later than 30 November 2023. Proposals will be reviewed by a panel consisting of the current LSGL copresidents and Kyushu University faculty members.
